Some of the highlights over the past 12 months;

- DTA has more lights available to us for use of our winter competitions. The lighting project was partly funded by Grants and came in under budget with Dubbo Touch contributing \$36,000. This will be a welcomed addition to our current winter competition as we can not only expand our numbers but be able to offer an earlier night for both players and volunteers.
- 2. The successful tender that Dubbo was able to secure of NSWTA Junior State Cup Northern Conference for another 3 years. The tender wouldn't have been possible without Dubbo Regional Council and was once again a great success for DTA and DRC. It was again the largest sporting carnival event ever held in Dubbo with 204 teams. The injection into the local economy, the vibe around the fields and also around town for the weekend and not to mention the high quality touch that was played by not only all teams but in particular our Dubbo teams was outstanding. We appreciate the support from the sub committee and other volunteers who assisted over the weekend. Massive effort for an amazing weekend.
- 3. 91 teams in the Junior Competitions, Heidi Spratt ran the competition again this year with more helpers and was an awesome competition played at the back end of 2023, we were able to secure some good sponsors for the competition, which also led into rep as well. We look forward to seeing more juniors running around down at touch this year.
- 4. The Struddy's Safari Women's Series grew to eight teams this summer in two 6 week competitions before and after Christmas. We also were able to see an exhibition match that was held on international womens day was quite the highlight of the season.

Our Junior comp is running at capacity with 91 teams in competitions from U7 to U15's, that is almost 900 kids playing in our junior comp, amazing. Junior Rep teams;

We had excellent representation at all junior events including Don Green Western Junior Championships in Mudgee in November, Central Coast Mini's, which unfortunately due to weather didn't go ahead, Pete Wilson Memorial Championships at Nelson Bay early February and most importantly the Northern Conference of the Junior State Cup Northern Conference held in Dubbo. Our junior Rep teams continue to develop and improve year after year, due to the commitment of Tracey W, Emma F, the individual coaches and Managers of the teams. The commitment to training has been outstanding and all teams worked really hard. Senior Competitions;

In our Summer comps We had 54 Mixed teams registered and 25 Men's teams with 8 teams in the Womens Safari Series which is increasing each comp.

Our current winter teams have 15 teams in our mens comp and 34 teams in mixed. Our mixed comp has expanded from 2023 winter. It has been great to see the lights on fields 4-9 running, this allows our comp to expand but also allows us to be able to just run two time slots, rather than 4. I feel that the committee and in particular comp coordinators are happy to be getting home in time for dinner now.

During 2023 winter comp we trialled a mens 30's short comp and double headers and also went to 30min time slots which was welcomed according to our survey.
